What is Community Led Housing?

- 1 Community integrally involved throughout the process.
- 2 Presumption in favour of a long-term role for the community
- 3 Benefits to the community are defined and protected in perpetuity.





What is Community Led Housing;

"Community-led housing (CLH) involves local people playing a leading and lasting role in solving housing problems, creating genuinely affordable homes and strong communities"

Community Land Trusts - Key defining features

- Community owned and controlled
- Open and democratic structure
- Permanently affordable homes or other assets
- Not for profit
- Long term stewardship

10 rented homes 2 shared ownership 7 self build plots



Strawberry Fields

- 17 homes 13 affordable (9 social rent, 4 shared ownership, 4 sale)
- A well-considered, 'landscape-led' design with both private gardens and open spaces to give a rural, nor sub-urban character
- An 'open' and enhanced habitat-led approach that allows residents, visitors, wildlife and ecology to enjoy the site and flourish
- Low-energy homes that are generous in size and flexible to suit a variety of lifestyles and needs in the longterm
- Enhanced ecological value across the site with new and reinvigorated hedgerows and other planting
- A contemporary interpretation of the Sussex vernacular architecture
- Strong support from Wealden Housing and Homes England (grant)




WHAT IT LOOKS LIKE - COHOUSING
